III. Presentations

LA River Master Plan Update - Los Angeles County Flood Control District (LACFCD)

Seta Marjanian (PW) presented on the LA River Master Plan update. The Master Plan update was initiated by the Board of Supervisors to update the previous 1996 Plan. The Plan took three years to develop and included various forms of community engagement and planning. The structure of the Plan is as follows:

- Community input, serving as the foundation of the plan
- Establishment of a series of strategic direction: comprised of several of goals/methods/actions (i.e., water conservation, flood risk, parks, access, etc.)
- Establishment of Design Aspect/Guidelines including identification of project sites, and creation of a menu of common project elements.

The Plan identifies 5 major opportunity zones – 2 of which are within the Lower LA River. On 6/14, the BOS adopted the following: 1) Land Bank Pilot, 2) LARMP Update, and 3) Implementation for the LARMP Update

IV. Agency / Project Updates

• LACFCD - Public Equestrian Rest Area (PERA)

Zeke Okoya (PW) provided the update on the PERA Project. PERA is a multi-use and equestrian facility located in the City of Long Beach, adjacent to the LA River on LACFCD property. The project features equestrian amenities, DG path, and landscaping improvements. PERA is currently under construction and scheduled to be complete summer 2022.



• San Gabriel & Lower LA Rivers & Mountains Conservancy (RMC)

Southeast LA (SELA) Cultural Center

Joe Gonzalez (RMC) provided the update on the SELA Cultural Center. The Cultural Center is a planned 80,000 sq ft. multi-use arts facility located near South Gate at the current LACFCD Imperial Yard Maintenance Facility. Project team is preparing to start CEQA Phase – likely to be led by RMC later this summer. Currently, RMC is assisting LACFCD on potential relocation sites for the maintenance yard. RMC released RFP for Community Engagement and Outreach in March – due 6/30.

River Ranger Pilot Program REACH Zone at the Lower LA River and Rio Hondo Confluence

Suely Saro (RMC) provided the update for the River Ranger Pilot Program. The program stems from AB 1558 and the associated Los Angeles Ranger River Establishment Plan that was completed in May 2019 by RMC, WCA, and SMMC. Pilot is located at the Rio Hondo and LA River Confluence (Reach Zone 1). Five services are provided: Maintenance, Public Safety, Outreach, Interpretive/Educational Programs, and Administrative Coordination. RFP for Program Evaluation Services released in April 2022 – currently pending review. Pilot Kickoff back in April 30th, 2022. Other past events include the River in Action Environmental Education Workshops held in April and May, and the River Ambassador Implementation on June 20th, 2022.

Lower LA River Recreation and Park District

Suely Saro (RMC) provided the update on the Lower LA River Recreation and Park District. Initiated by SB1374 (2016). RMC has been assisting to facilitate its establishment. Next Steps: create legal boundary definitions of the Park District to submit to State Board for Equalization for approval.

Watershed Conservation Authority - Parque Dos Rios

Johnathan Perisho (WCA) provided an update on Parque Dos Rios. The project is located north of Imperial Hwy adjacent to the west bank of the LA River. Implementation of first phase completed in August 2021; impact to the site by vandalism postponed its opening to later this year. Project is currently open to public however WCA is evaluation additional improvements to site before having an official opening.

LA Neighborhood Land Trust - Maywood River Front Park

Arturo Gonzalez (RMC) provided an update on the Maywood Riverfront Park Project on behalf of the LA Neighborhood Trust. Project was initially done in phases, Phase I on the northern end (2007), and Phase II on southern end (2014). Project amenities include active recreational enhancements, native landscaping, and access improvements. Planning, funding procurements for renovations to the park are



ongoing. The Park will also feature the Sleepy Lagoon Memorial Concept Project led by EYCEJ, a memorial wall and bench. RMC provided \$2 million in grant funding towards the park improvements in May 2022. Park is anticipated to be fully renovated in 3-5 years.

- City of Long Beach Long Beach Municipal Stormwater Treatment (LB-MUST)
 Cecilia Salazar (City of Long Beach) provided the update to the LB-MUST project.

 Project is located 1 mile north of Downtown Long Beach on the east bank of the LA River. Project timeline:
 - 2021-2023: Phase I currently in construction (facility and brackish wetlands)
 - 2022-2024: Design Phase II (expand conveyance network
 - 2024-2026: Construction of Phase II
- Conservation Corps of Long Beach (updates provided by Dan Knapp)
 - Wrigley Greenbelt: Approximate 1 mile trail adjacent to the LA River; project elements include native landscaping, bioswales, rest areas and walking paths.
 Project currently under construction scheduled to be complete winter 2022/23.
 - DeForest Park and Wetlands: Proposed Environmental Education Center located at Deforest Park. CCLB will utilize center as resource node for the Lower River. Scheduled to be open fall 2022.
- City of South Gate (updates provided by Steve Costley)
 - Urban Orchard: Construction is ongoing; looking to complete Dec 2022/January 2023
 - Circle Park: Received \$2 million grant from RMC; project currently in design phase. Project looking to go out to bid in September 2022 and compete construction/open to public June 2023.


